The State Building Trades Council has been active and successful in politics that affect our membership the past few years. Senate Bill 7 was signed by Governor Brown to protect prevailing wage. This bill was noteworthy, because of its bipartisan coauthorship from Republican Senator Anthony Cannella of Ceres, and Democratic Senate President Pro Tem Darrell Steinberg of Sacramento. It gives charter cities a strong, unmistakable fiscal incentive to adhere to the state policy that provides for prevailing wage.

This is a great victory for California's construction workers and their families. This Bill and many others are being signed into law because unions have worked hard to elect candidates that put the interest of California's working families and the State of California ahead of partisanship.

On June 3rd, you will have the opportunity to voice your opinion as a union member and an American. We feel you have the right to know what candidates will stand for your interests as a member of the union workforce. Local races are very important to all union craft workers. Labor friendly Supervisors, City Council Members, School Board Members, etc., play a very important role in Project Labor Agreements, Contractor Pre-qualification, Apprenticeship Language, Prevailing Wages, and the awarding of contracts. We have listed the labor endorsed candidates in this newsletter. Please take the time to study the issues and candidates, and make your voice heard during this election.




Our apprentices have another year to advance and improve their skills for next year's Regional Contest, which will be held in Southern California.

When he was 17 his family moved up to Alameda and then Oakland. He attended Fremont High as a senior, where he met his future wife Cathie. Bill said the first time he saw her, he knew that they were going to be together. He thought she was a real cutie. A couple years later they were married with two kids and moved to Livermore. Bill started his tile career and worked his way up to journeymen tilelayer, foreman, superintendent and just recently an instructor for the tile apprenticeship school. He really loved teaching and was proud that he was giving back. Bill always referred to the apprentices as his kids. Bill was a true craftsman and had great abilities. He did everything with speed and perfection. He was proud of his last job in San Francisco at Medrone Towers, due to the quality of work,



and the friendships that were made.

Bill had a passion for BMX racing and passed it down to everyone in his family, even his wife. He was a #1 National Champion for several years. Bill also manufactured bikes for five companies and produced his own bikes called Quicksilver Bikes. Bill was highly respected and recognized in the BMX world.


Bill was truly a great golfer with an amazing swing. Bill and his wife really enjoyed playing golf together.

From Field Representative STEVE KANTONIEMI

In April, I.U. President Jim Boland was in town and visited Bay Area job-sites to talk with our union members on issues about work, safety, and other union issues. The visits were primarily to see some of the BEST CRAFTWORKERS in the field.

We visited the newly remodeled and reopened Huntington Hotel, located on Nobhill at 1075 California Street in San Francisco. BAC 3 contractor D & J Tile was on-site. Ed Brunelle was the foreman on this job managing the crews of tile layers and finishers. President Boland was able to tour the hotel and appreciate some high end, exquisite stone tile being installed.

The UCSF Medical Center located in San Francisco was our next stop. This is a massive project with multiple BAC 3 contractors and trades doing work onsite. Carrara Marble, with foreman Joe Kisner and 3 crews of marble masons and finishers were installing a stone veneer on the outside of the building. The Carrara crew really seemed to enjoy talking shop with President Boland. We were also given an inside tour of this huge hospital. President Boland spoke with tile members working for De Anza Tile & Marble, and viewed many of the multiple porcelain, ceramic, and stone tiles that were installed throughout the Medical Center.

We also went to the new PAMF hospital located in Redwood City. BAC 3 contractor Superior Tile and Stone was on-site with foreman David Silva running the project. The scope of work is "lick and stick" stone veneer with thousands upon thousands of square feet of tile in open spaces, walk ways, hall ways and of course bathrooms and showers. President Boland watched our members perform top quality hands on work, while getting a chance to speak and take pictures with our members.
